

Reboot Summary



Reboot is a method of making disciples, designed for believers who have been involved in established churches. When a computer slows down and stops functioning effectively, we must reboot it. The same is true for believers, as we often find ourselves in unhealthy patterns and “busy work” inherited from tradition. The solution is to “reboot” using the Scriptures as our primary textbook and the Holy Spirit as our primary teacher. *Reboot* aims to achieve three primary goals:

1. To develop a lifestyle of obedience to Jesus, giving highest priority to the Great Commission
2. To unlearn and relearn the foundational truths of Christian faith and service
3. To model dynamically the New Testament church, preparing believers to start new churches
